Bike Details: First time at this event for this lightweight two-stroke. It's just completed the Sunbeam MCC London to Brighton Run!

Bike Details: I have owned this bike for over a decade, it was originally owned by the same owner (who raced at Brooklands in the 1930's) as the Model 19. As far as I know he used the two bikes at competition meetings. It has been restored. Was used for racing, Hill Climbs and Sprints - now Parades and Shows.

Bike Details: This is a very original, unrestored motorcycle. It had a complete engine rebuild some years ago following an engine failure and has a crankcase repair, a new big-end assembly, conrod, piston and barrel re-sleeved back to standard, not that you can tell from outside. Finished in used engine oil to keep the rust under control, very little original paint left. Most parts have to be manufactured as NOS spares are just not available after 94 years!

Manufactured for 2 years only 1928/1929. Made by the Collier Brothers to enable the rider to enter road time trials and other specialist events

Bike Details: This racing machine is fitted with a Brooklands Two-stroke engine, which was also used in a plane.

Bike Details: Early rigid frame example of the OHC Norton which eventually developed to become the post-war Manx Norton. This has a few later updates including centre feed racing type magnesium cambox, hairspring valves, close ratio gearbox with Daytona kick-start first gear, internal throttle stop to give tickover with TT carb. Refurbished in the 1990s and now regularly used on the road. Handles beautifully - as long as I avoid the potholes.

New Imperial last raced at the Isle of Man TT in 1936 winning the Lightweight 250cc class. This model shares a number of GP race class engine components and included polished ports. This bike was previously owned by the New Imperial guru Aled Williams from North Wales, he was a founder member of the New Imperial Owners Association and this bike sat in his dining room for over 20 years.

Bike Details: I have owned the bike for 35 years, bought incomplete & missing many parts. With the help of The Vincent OC, for which I am truly grateful, it took 17 years to rebuild completely. As bought in 1990 it had the wrong rear-frame member (please ask) & the wrong forks. It was fitted with Triumph Herald car wheels & home-made hubs, disc brakes front & rear, trailer mudguards and a chrome headlamp. The engine was broken (front cam spindle) and worn badly just about everywhere else. With great help from Mac Read, Derek Sayer & many others in the VOC and lots of money (that's why it took so long) it was back on the road in 2007. It now has: 12v electrics with 'Macdouglatator' alternator, electric starter, V2 multi-plate clutch, BTH mag, Shadow brake drums, replica Lightning brake plates plus many parts replaced. Mileage is since the rebuild & I couldn't resist the 5" speedo. First registered on 18/9/1947

Bike Details: Purchased 2003, first registered on 24/3/53. With around 55,000 miles on the clock in remarkably original condition complete with dealer's brass plates, starts easily & runs quietly. After some light re-commissioning work including a magneto overhaul, it was fit for the road. I have deliberately avoided re-spraying or cosmetic improvement, preferring an original patina of age as opposed to a better-than-factory appearance. One minor concession was to paint the cylinder barrel with pot-black, as it was very rusty. Other necessary work has been to lightly bore the barrel to remove a step necessitating an oversize piston & new valve guides, & relining the petrol tank after the sealant broke up, causing the valves to stick. I have covered more than 15,000 miles since owning her, typical statistics I suspect. Despite its relative slowness it always gives me a comfortable ride & great pride of ownership.

Avon Autos of Hanwell started to import Adler MB250's in late 1954 Expensive at £220 - only about 10 still exist in the UK.

Club: Norton OC (Surrey) Bike Details: The AJS Model 18S 500 cc is almost identical to the Matchless G80 and both were produced in the same Associated Motor Cycles (AMC) London factory from 1945 to 1966. These bikes represent the end of the era of big British singles, as when AMC merged with Norton production concentrated on twins. Engine - 498 cc Single cylinder, pushrod 2 valve, four-stroke. Bore / stroke 82.5 mm × 93 mm (3.25 in × 3.66 in) Power 28bhp @ 5600rpm (late models) Transmission four 4-speed AMC gearbox. Wheelbase 55" (140 cm) Weight 394 pounds (179 kg) (dry Fuel capacity three gallons. The 500 c long-stroke AJS 18CS was produced from 1951 through 1955. In 1956 it was replaced by the shorter stroke, larger bore models that used the same numeric codes. The bore of these early models was 82.5 mm (3.25 in), while the 1956 through 1966 "short stroke" (final version) models had a bore of 86 mm (3.39 in). The C was for Competition (Scrambles) and the S for Suspension (not a rigid rear frame).

<p>Club:</p> <p>Bike Details: When the Power Pak was announced in April 1950 by Sinclair Goddard & Co Ltd of 162 Queensway, Bayswater, London W2, the firm claimed that the bike's main features were "lightweight, simplicity, a positive non-slip drive, ease of fitting, and lack of vibration". The specification included an Amal carburettor, Wico-Pacy ignition and a KLG waterproof spark plug.
